

New Student Application for Admission Process (PreK-8th Grades)

- Visit campus and/or attend a parent information meeting
- Schedule student visit (students may come at the same time as the parent visit)
- Submit completed Application for Admission including parent questionnaires (and student questionnaires for 6th-8th) with \$50 per student Registration Fee deposit (will be deducted from Registration Fee).
- Schedule parent interview

Applicants will receive notification of the outcome of application within two weeks of the parent interview. There are three possible outcomes: acceptance, denial, on-hold. If an application is placed on-hold, Liberty will notify acceptance status as soon as possible. In the event of denial, the Registration Fee deposit will be refunded. At the time of acceptance, the remainder of the non-refundable student Registration Fee of \$450 per family or \$225 for part-time high school students will be due along with a completed Enrollment Packet. Additionally, families will:

- Submit \$100 per student Supply Fee by June 1
- Submit first semester tuition by August 1
- Submit second semester tuition by January 15

Returning Student Re-enrollment Process (PreK-8th Grades)

- Complete the Application for Admission including parent questionnaires (and student questionnaires for 6th – 8th)
- Complete the Enrollment Packet (risk waiver/medical form, photo waiver, course selection)
- Submit one-half of Registration Fee with application (Registration fee is \$450 per family per year)
- Submit second half of Registration Fee by May 1 (\$225)
- Submit \$100 per student Supply Fee by June 1
- Submit first semester tuition & fees by August 1
- Submit second semester tuition & fees by January 15

Enrollment Process for High School Students:

- Submit completed Application for Admission with applicable Registration Fee (\$225 Part-time student or \$450 Family Registration Fee for full-time)
- Submit completed Enrollment Packet with \$25 per class Supply Fee by June 1 (or the regular Supply Fee of \$100 if enrolling in full-time program*)
- Submit first semester tuition by August 1
- Submit second semester tuition by January 15

* Enrollment in 4 or more courses is considered full-time for high school students.

New student visitation dates may be scheduled. To limit the disruption to our students and tutors, younger siblings may not sit in on classes with parents. Please secure childcare for infants and toddlers at home on your campus visit day. Arrive at 9:00 a.m. so that we may show your students to their classrooms at the beginning of the new class period. This will provide the smoothest transition for everyone. Parents will be invited to observe classes, and transition to new classrooms as inconspicuously as possible to minimize distractions for the classes in session.
